Disrespectful to adults/peers	Teacher conferences with student; written warning sent home and apology note written to other individual	Parent/Teacher conference	Parent conference with Administrator and student completes Behavior Reflection.
Inappropriate clothing	Teacher calls home requesting change of clothes	Parent/Teacher conference	Parent conference with Administrator and student completes Behavior Reflection.

CONSEQUENCES

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO REINFORCE SCHOOL-WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOR SUPPORT?

- Learn and model the School-Wide Behavioral Expectations
- Find the connections between the school-wide discipline plan and your classroom management plan (it creates consistency!)
- Find opportunities to refer to the behavioral guidelines and expectations in your lessons (Be Safe, Be Responsible, and Be Respectful)
- Consider misbehavior as an opportunity for learning. Will the consequence teach the student what to do next time?
- Look for and acknowledge students who display the behavioral expectations (verbal praise, stickers, positive notes home, high five, etc.)
